## MAKING THE MOST OF YOUR US COLLEGE APPLICATION EXPERIENCE

The admissions process to selective colleges in the United States has become increasingly competitive in the last two decades. More students than ever are applying as a result of changes in socio economic demographics and the ease of online applications. The same

is true for international students. Available data for 2005-2015 reveals that the number of international students attending US schools has increased from 600,000 in 2005 to almost 1.000.000 in 2015. Interestingly, up to 64% of these students are Asians, a region of the world where family culture is obsessed with education and, thus, students are generally highly qualified and competitive. The most popular careers among international students Science-Technology-Engineering-Math or STEM (44%) and Business (20%).

This has made it increasingly important for students to take their application process seriously and to start preparing as early as 8th and 9th grade. In our experience, the process can be scary even for the most

accomplished students, but planning ahead can reduce the stress caused by the application process and can actually turn the admissions process into a valuable educational and developmental experience. That is actually the best part for us! We help and inspire them to do some soul searching in order to identify their passions and most important personal attributes. In the process, we help them find the right colleges and prepare excellent application with excellent and memorable essays that stand out.

We always recommend students to do the best they can at academics. That is the number one factor! They should also start exploring their passions early on by trying different activities: music, art, sports, robotics, dance, community service, collecting, writing, etc. We suggest that they pursue

their favorite activities in high school and do something really unique. We always encourage pursuing community service activities, but we emphasize that they should get involved in activities that are meaningful to them. If they are art lovers or soccer fans, for example, they can teach art or soccer skills to children who might not have the opportunity to learn that activity otherwise. If they know how to build robots, why not take robotics lessons to public "bateyes" schools. and orphanages around the Dominican Republic? These actions will enrich their personal stories and make it easier to put together college applications that stand out!

We invite all registered families to buy a ticket; also other mem-


bers of the CMS community may purchase tickets under the name of a registered CMS family to support this fundraiser.
